Innovative approaches to communication invite interdisciplinary exchanges and experimenting, as well as creative actions and debates on social issues. Akademie President and filmmaker Jeanine Meerapfel joins Federal Government Commissioner for Culture and the Media Monika Grütters and Kolumba Director Stefan Kraus in a dialogue on the future of museums, the Humboldt Forum as a new prototype, the challenges of digitilisation and provenance research.
